#### **Job Accommodation Network (JAN)**

JAN is a natural starting point for an organization who has questions on everything from specific ADA scenerios to general ideas on how to support an employee with a disability. JAN is a free and confidential service of the U.S. Department of Labor's Office of Disability Employment Policy.

#### **Job Descriptions using O\*NET**

The Online Information Network (O\*NET) offers a user guide for writing effective job descriptions. O\*NET is a database of occupational requirements and employee attributes — providing knowledge, skills, and abilities required as well as how the job is performed in terms of tasks, activities, and other descriptors. O\*NET is developed by the Employment and Training Administration with the U.S. Department of Labor.
